### The 29th All-Ryukyu Karate and Kobudo Tournament Guidelines

(1) Convention Date and Time: Sunday, June 23rd, 2024, 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

## **The 29th All-Ryukyu Karate and Kobudo Tournament**

This year's tournament is the 29th annual event. The opening ceremony will be held at 9:00 a.m.

Until then, please pick up your bib at the entrance to the venue and prepare for the opening ceremony.

This tournament aims to promote the sound development of youth, the inheritance and development of Okinawa's traditional culture, and international exchange through karate.

(1) The opening ceremony will be held at 9:30. Follow the directions and organize by grade level.

(2) Bibs will be distributed at the tournament venue. Each competitor must receive their number and attach it to the back of their vest with a safety pin.

(3) Designated courts (each court on the wood floor without mats) Matting only on the final main event court

(1) Court 1 - 1st and 2nd-grade elementary school (kata, padded Kumite)

(2) Court 2 - 3rd-grade elementary school boys (kata, padded Kumite)

(3) Court 3 - 3rd and 4th-grade elementary school girls, 4th-grade elementary school boys (kata, padded kumite)

(4) Court 4 - 5th and 6th-grade elementary school (kata, padded kumite)

(5) Court 5 - Junior High School Students (Kata/Full Contact)

(6) Court 6 - High School Students and General (Kata, Full Contact, and Kobudo)

The main event court will start according to the progress of the Kata division in each court.

Court assignments are subject to change depending on the progress of the day.

Therefore, any changes to the schedule will be announced throughout the event day.

(4) Kata and Kobudo divisions: When a player's name is called, they must bow outside of the court, then advance to the center of the court and bow again.

After bowing, say your Name, the name of the dojo, and the Name of the kata in a loud voice, and begin the kata immediately. When the kata is finished, proceed to the outside line of the court and wait until the score is announced. When the total score is announced, bow and return to your seat. Anyone who has not called out their name will be disqualified.

(5) Padded Kumite competition: Players must wear the following protective gear and wait in advance. Those who are not present when their names are called shall be disqualified.

Shin guards, fist supporters, head supporters, women's chest supporters

Junior high, high school, and general boys must wear a foul cup.

The actual match tends to be 1 point with 2 technical ari. Match time for elementary and junior high school students and the general women's division is 1 minute. For high school students and the general men's division, the match lasts 2 minutes, with 1 minute of extra time to be decided by red or white. In overtime, the referee must raise the red or white flag to decide.

Face-thrusting, kinetic kicking, grabbing, hooking, knee-kicking with the hands at the sides, and tossing opponents are prohibited. A fighter shall be disqualified for two (2) penalties with one (1) technical ari, and for severe penalties with one (1) disqualification.

If the player does not get up within 5 seconds after falling down, one point is to be made.

Any competitor who fails to follow the referee's instructions shall be disqualified. No objection will be allowed to the referee's decision. Any person who may object or yell at the referee shall be ejected from the venue, and if they fail to comply, they shall be removed by the police for obstruction of business.

(6) Each court will play until the championship game, and the awarding ceremony and trophy presentation will be held immediately after the game at the headquarters table. Since commemorative photos will be taken, each court attendant should lead the winners to the headquarters table to have the trophies awarded and commemorative photos taken.

(7) Other matters shall be in accordance with the match regulations of the All-Ryukyu Karate and Kobudo Federation.
